

## ANIMAL CONTROL HELPS WITH:

### Lost Animals:

If your pet becomes lost and is wearing his/her City of Highland tag at the time of impoundment, every effort will be made to notify you by telephone or by mail. To be on the safe side, it is always best to come to the shelter to look for your lost pet. Retention periods are ten (10) days for license identified animals and three (3) days for unlicensed animals.

### Licensing Your Dog:

Every dog, four months of age and older, are required by law to be licensed. For your convenience, the attached license application may be used to obtain a dog license. Rabies vaccination is given at 4 months and needs to be obtained before a license can be issued.

### Animal Adoption:

The San Bernardino County Animal shelter has various ages of dogs and cats available for adoption each day. In addition, members of the Southern California Veterinary Medical Association will provide a free veterinary examination for all adopted dogs and cats.

## LAW = DOG LEASH

### Leashing Your Dog Will:

1. Keep your neighbors, friends, and children from unwanted trespassing by your curious, or over friendly pet
2. A leash will help avoid accidental injury to people, which could lead to costly litigation
3. Keep your best friend safe from bolting into traffic or other random injuries
4. Keep your vet bills to a minimum
5. Identify yourself as a responsible pet owner
6. Safeguard the best interest of the citizens of Highland, where you and your pet (s) live and play
